Before coming to NIDRR in 2011, Mr. Lakin was Director of Research and Training Center on Community Living at the University of Minnesota. In his career Mr. Lakin has directed dozens of research and training projects and has authored or co-authored 300 publications based on that work. He has consulted frequently with state, federal and international agencies in matters of policy, research and evaluation. Among recognitions for his work are appointments by President Clinton to the President's Committee on Persons with Intellectual Disabilities, the American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities' Dybwad Humanitarian Award, the University of Minnesota's Outstanding Community Service Award and the Distinguished Research Award of The Arc of the United States.
